

WARNING

YOU ARE HEREBY INFORMED OF POTENTIAL LEGAL ACTIONS WHICH MAY BE TAKEN AGAINST YOU FOR FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH ORDERS ISSUED BY THE COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND ENVIRONMENT.

The State of Colorado and local jurisdictions have declared emergencies due to the rapid spread and grave health risk of the COVID-19 virus, otherwise known as Coronavirus. To slow the spread of this highly contagious disease, the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment has issued Fourth Updated Public Health Order 20-24 dated April 9, 2020, which is enforceable by law.

Tri-County Health Department (TCHD), the District Public Health Agency for the Counties of Adams, Arapahoe and Douglas, Colorado, has received reports that your business has failed to comply with the directives contained in Public Health Order 20-24, as updated, by either continuing to operate a non-critical business; by failing to comply with the restaurant and bar requirements; or by failing to comply with social distancing requirements applicable to critical businesses set forth in Public Health Order 20-24, as updated.

PLEASE VOLUNTARILY AND WILLFULLY COMPLY WITH ALL HEALTH DEPARTMENT ORDERS FOR YOUR OWN HEALTH AND SAFETY AND FOR THE HEALTH AND SAFETY OF OTHERS

If this is your first notification of the importance of complying with Public Health Orders, and you respond to this request to voluntarily comply, no legal action will be taken against you

IF YOU DO NOT COMPLY, OR YOU HAVE PREVIOUSLY BEEN NOTIFIED OF YOUR OBLIGATIONS TO COMPLY, YOU MAY FACE ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING LEGAL ACTIONS

- 1. Become subject to an immediate Public Health Order to close
- 2. Be subject to civil and criminal penalties and actions, which may include a court order to close your business
- 3. Be subject to an immediate revocation of your business license
- 4. Be subject to a revocation of food handling and licensing permits
- 5. Given a citation or summons to appear in court on criminal violations
- 6. Information regarding non-compliance may be used against you during renewal process of any special license or permits you hold
